

Bird Species, Eumarella Shores, Lake Weyba, Noosa

Guest are requested to keep the wildlife wild, please do not feed.

- Early mornings see herons, cormorants and egrets gracefully searching for food in the shallows of the lake shore.
- Evenings bring the abundant tawny frogmouth and, if lucky, various owls.
- Kookaburras, minors, butcher birds and magpies will happily arrive on your verandah for breakfast posing for the odd photo or two.
- Majestic whistling kites, black cockatoos, osprey, white bellied sea eagles and more soar overhead.
- Perhaps you will be one of the select few to observe the rare and endangered Australian Stork (Jabiru) feeding in the shallows.
- See the nesting pair of Brahmin kites who have resided around this die of the lake for many seasons now.
- Watch the amazing skill of the cormorants herding fish with the crafty pelicans lurking in the background to pick up the spoils!
